REVIEW SUMMARY

We have reviewed the financial statements of the business-type activities and the fiduciary funds of South Georgia State College, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2024, and issued our report thereon, dated November 5, 2024. We conducted our review engagement in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services promulgated by the Accounting and Review Services Committee of the AICPA. We have performed the procedures on compliance with federal student financial assistance regulations reflected within the 2023 OMB Compliance Supplement for the year ended June 30, 2024. South Georgia State College is responsible for complying with federal student financial assistance regulations reflected within the 2023 OMB Compliance Supplement. South Georgia State College has agreed to and acknowledged that the procedures performed are appropriate to meet the intended purpose of evaluating compliance with federal student financial assistance regulations as reflected in the 2023 OMB Compliance Supplement and meeting the requirements of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) as reflected in the SACSCOC Principles of Accreditation, Section 13.6 for the year ended June 30, 2023.
